COMMUNITY SERVICE: LEARNING FROM SERVING

One global experience greatly inspired Pham Vu Minh Ngoc. In 2014, she and several fellow undergraduates headed to remote Au Giang in Vietnam to teach English to poor students.

She recalled "The amazing experience taught me so much more than I expected. The students didn't have the most basic vocabulary yet they had such determination to learn. Their tenacity made me realise that problems are not to be avoided. The villagers' no-frills way of life also taught me to appreciate the simple things in life."



For Manorama Singh, Project Luminaire 2 literally shone light on the value of community service.

Project Luminaire 2 was a mission to light up Filipino households with solar-powered light made from recycled bottles.

Reflected Manorama, "I realised that service is about thinking sincerely about the real needs of others and helping with the understanding that everybody is potentially in need of help. With this, I began connecting with my identity as a global citizen who has received all kinds of help from this world and who has the responsibility to give back in any way I can."

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
