\$80,000 in co-funding for three proposals on raising awareness of Trafficking in Persons

Three proposals aimed at raising the awareneess of trafficiking in persons or TIP in Singapore will receive co funding of \$80,000.

The recipients include EmancipAsia; a joint submission from UN Women and Humanitarian Organisation for Migration Economics (HOME); and a submission from National University of Singapore and Singapore Management University.

The Singapore Inter-Agency Taskforce on Trafficking-in-Persons, TIP, said some of the initiatives proposed include a photography exhibition, E-surveys for data collection, and seminars for various stakeholders.

The grant was launched in January this year to encourage more organisations and individuals to take a firm stand against TIP and help raise public awareness on the issue.

Five proposals were received.
