SINGAPORE, Dec 4 (Bernama) -- Singapore's President Tony Tan Keng Yam has closed four trades worth US\$400 million at ICAP's 22nd global Charity Day - a day where 100 percent of revenues and commissions will be donated to local charities.

ICAP, the world's leading interdealer broker, held its annual global Charity Day on Wednesday across more than 60 offices worldwide including Singapore.

For the third year running, Tan joined celebrities and ICAP employees to raise funds for seven local charities: The President's Challenge, Ain Society, Down Syndrome Association (Singapore), Inspirasia, KK Women and Children's Hospital, Singapore Management University, and SPD.

This year's Charity Day will lend support to 200 charities globally, impacting the lives of millions.

Since its inception in 1993, ICAP Charity Day has raised over 110 million euros (about US\$135.40 million) for more than 1,600 charities.
