Centre to study human behaviour to be set up

THE Agency for Science. Technology and Research (A*Star) and the Singapore Management University (SMU) will establish a centre, tapping high-performance computing technology, Big Data analytics and behavioural sciences, to study human behaviour. Called the Centre for Technology and Social-Behavioural Insights (CTSBI), it will study people-centric issues and human behaviour, including how people think, feel and act in different settings. Such information can be used to enhance planning and address issues in different areas, A*Star and SMU said yesterday. The centre will be officially operational from July 1 and is funded by

July 1 and is funded by A*Star's Joint Council Office (JCO). SMU will contribute manpower and other research resources. It will be helmed by two co-directors, Victor Tong from A*Star and David

Chan from SMU.

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
