NTUC to offer more job opportunists for senior workers

Singapore: The National Trades Union Congress (NTUC), with its focus on senior workers, has decided to offer significant work opportunities for members who are professionals, managers and executives (PMEs).

For the first time at its U Live Symposium on Sunday, the labor movement presented 15 PME job openings wherein each recipient will be paid at least \$\$2,000 per month. The symposium is a yearly event organized to encourage active living among seniors and offer a wider range of work to them including in middle management positions.

A total of 1,300 job openings were on offer at the symposium.

NTUC president, Diana Chia said that it was essential to guarantee that PME workers are occupied and also have worthwhile jobs at hand.

She said: "They are also part of our rank and file workers, and this is an important aspect for people to realize that we are all moving up in our career, and we are all going up for higher education."

Around 3,000 PMEs participated in the U Live Symposium at Singapore Management University.
