SPEECH BY PROFESSOR ARNOUD DE MEYER, SMU PRESIDENT AT SMU COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY 2018 TUESDAY, 31 JULY 2018, AT SMU HALL

Guest of Honour, Mr Heng Swee Keat, Minister of Finance; Mr JY Pillay, Chancellor, SMU; Mr Ho Kwon Ping, Chairman, SMU Board of Trustees; Members of the Board of Trustees; Faculty, staff and students of SMU; Parents and guests; Good afternoon.

My thanks to all of you who have kept up the SMU tradition of contributing collectively to a graduating class scholarship. Your contributions will enable needy students to enjoy the SMU education you had. We truly appreciate your generosity.
