

SMU sets up career centre for students to engage with firms

SINGAPORE - The Singapore Management University (SMU) has launched a state-of-the-art facility for its students to engage and connect with prospective employers or internship partners in a conducive setting.

Located at the SMU Administration Building, the Dato' Kho Hui Meng Career Centre (DKHMCC) - named after Dato' Kho Hui Meng for his contribution of S\$1.35 million to SMU - aims to better prepare students for the corporate world and workplace through career planning, education and resource support.

The centre will help SMU students chart their career directions and empower them with the necessary skills to realise their potential and goals.

It will host a range of career training programmes, enrichment skills workshops, career events and internship placement arrangements as well as provide a business-like environment for students looking for jobs or internships to exchange ideas and experiences.

Students will also have access to a variety of on-line services and resources.

They can use their mobile phones and tablets to access the internship and job opportunities on the go, set job alerts, sign up for events and make appointments with career counsellors.

Students can choose from a reservoir of more than 3,000 industry and job function-related interview questions, get tips on answering questions and record their interviews for review.
