
reate miniature decorative figures out of loose wool just by poking the wool repeatedly with a needle. Needle felting is a technique which uses a barbed needle to tangle different layers of wool together,

The final-year business student at Singapore Management University says: "When needle felting, be sure to do it against a soft backing, or your needle may crack or break."
