
# Shaping tomorrow's changemakers: How a leading university nurtures innovation to drive impact

# Where law and technology meet

In a world where technology is rapidly transforming societies, what drives change at the intersection of law and technology? For Mr Josh Lee Kok Thong, an SMU Law alumnus, the answer lies in embodying the change you want to see, while being guided by a strong set of values.

At SMU, Mr Lee gained a unique university experience that shaped his passion for law, policy and technology. Representing SMU at international mooting competitions gave him a taste of working on issues at the forefront of law and technology.

His experience as a co-founder of a student club, the SMU Funk Movement, defined his values and his spirit of entrepreneurship and creation. These invaluable experiences shaped Mr Lee into an industry leader at the intersection of law and technology, and a regional youth voice on topics like AI regulation and online safety.

Today, as the managing director (Asia-Pacific) at the Future of Privacy Forum, a member of Singapore's Media Literacy Council, and a recipient of Asia Society's Asia 21 Next Generation Leaders Fellowship and the National Youth Council's Asean Youth Fellowship, Mr Lee is empowering youths to shape the region's law and technology landscape.

His takeaways from his education can be described as tangible, transformative and timeless – providing a solid foundation to guide his desire for meaningful change in the world.

# Innovating for sustainability

Mr Ryan Ong's entrepreneurial journey began with a passion for sustainability. This led him to establish Fogo Fungi, a company focused on transforming agricultural waste into sustainable products.

His start-up is dedicated to reducing food waste by upcycling agricultural by-products such as timber waste, soy hulls and coffee grounds to cultivate gourmet mushrooms. This initiative seeks to minimise food waste, close the loop in the food system and drive a more sustainable, circular economy.

Through Fogo Fungi, Mr Ong supplies premium gourmet mushrooms to top chefs and hotels, exemplifying how innovation can drive growth while promoting sustainable practices.

## SMU's impact:

- Fogo Fungi was kick-started by the SMU Institute of Innovation and Entrepreneurship's (IIE) Business Innovations Generator (BIG) incubation programme, which provided mentorship and resources that helped Mr Ong to develop and grow his business.
- Through SMU-X, SMU's experiential learning framework, he worked on real-world sustainability projects, enhancing his understanding of sustainability challenges and business innovation.

• IIE's and SMU's network helped to connect Mr Ong with industry experts, refine his business model and position him for success in the green innovation space.



# Driving social change

What does it take to create real, lasting change in less privileged communities? For Ms Nazhath Faheema, it is a commitment to social inclusion, empowerment and collective care.

As the director of development and community relations at Hope Initiative Alliance (HIA), she builds impactful partnerships and leads initiatives that uplift underserved communities in Singapore. This includes migrant workers, domestic helpers, children and youth from low-income families, and persons living in rental housing.

She also leads Sowing Care Together, a movement in HIA that mobilises youth leaders, community volunteers, religious groups and other stakeholders to strengthen social cohesion and inspire inclusive action across diverse segments of society.

At HIA, Ms Nazhath is developing sustainable working models that facilitate long-term change for communities that need greater care and support. Her leadership drives impactful programmes focused on advancing social equity and harmony.

At the same time, she remains deeply committed to initiating, leading and facilitating interfaith dialogue to promote empathy and understanding. All while encouraging others to challenge societal barriers and contribute to a more inclusive world.

# **Building a wellness revolution**

Mr Daniel Soh's entrepreneurial journey began with a simple yet powerful belief: Everyone deserves to feel their best and have access to premium personal wellness products at affordable prices.

In September 2023, while still an SMU Accountancy student, Mr Soh co-founded Feel Fresh. His start-up focused on making premium-quality personal wellness products accessible to all, while providing exceptional after-sales customer care – a market gap he identified in the industry.

Feel Fresh has seen impressive growth, with revenue multiplying 10 times since the beginning of 2024. Mr Soh's disciplined approach, alongside strong support from his co-founder, friends, partner and family, has helped him balance academic demands, student life and his growing business.

Looking ahead, Feel Fresh plans to expand its product range, collaborate with influencers and enter new regional markets. But beyond business success, Mr Soh remains committed to giving back to the community, having sponsored key events at SMU and working on grassroots initiatives to promote oral hygiene among young children.
