## **Professor Lily KONG**

President and Lee Kong Chian Chair Professor of Social Sciences Singapore Management University

Professor Lily Kong is SMU's fifth President, and the first Singaporean to lead the 22-year old university. She is also the first Singaporean woman to head a university in Singapore. She was previously Provost of SMU, Vice Provost and Vice President at the National University of Singapore (in various portfolios).

Professor Kong is internationally known for her research on urban transformations, and social and cultural change in Asia. She has written extensively about communal relations, particularly, the intersection of religion and secularity in cities, creative industries/cities, urban heritage conservation, and smart cities. She is an award-winning researcher and teacher locally and internationally.

Apart from her research accomplishments, Prof Kong has led transformational change at SMU. Prof Kong has steered the university through significant growth, in undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing education programme enrolment, in research income, industry and international engagement, and in serving as a hub for entrepreneurial activity.

As Provost of SMU, she has driven projects that enhanced the quality of SMU's students and faculty, and its educational offerings and research. There was a major revamp of the university's undergraduate core curriculum, new interdisciplinary programmes were introduced, and the SMU Academy was established to offer skills upgrading programmes for working adults. As SMU President, she led the university through a strategic review to focus on three priority areas: digital transformation, sustainable living, and growth in Asia. Educational, research and engagement initiatives are well underway in these areas and the university has stepped up on engagement with industry and university partners, locally and internationally. SMU's first overseas centre was launched in Jakarta in 2022 to deepen SMU's engagements with the region.

Professor Kong was conferred the Singapore Public Service Star (BBM) in 2020 and Singapore Public Administration Medal (Silver) in 2006. In a global study by Stanford University (2020), Professor Kong was identified as among the world's top 1% of scientists in the field of Geography. Professor Kong has been recognised on Forbes Asia's Power Businesswomen list 2020, Forbes inaugural 50 over 50 (Asia 2022) and Tatler's Asia's Most Influential 2022. She was inducted into the Singapore Women's Hall of Fame in 2022.
