We believe that diverse communities enrich learning and strengthen excellence. When students from different backgrounds, cultures and worldviews come together, they sharpen one another's thinking — and deepen mutual understanding.

As so many leaders – CEOs, university presidents and others have recognised, diversity is not a distraction from excellence — it is essential to it. We echo that belief.

At SMU, we are proud of the diversity of our students and faculty. We are proud to be a university where differences are respected, and where people are valued not in spite of their uniqueness, but because of it.

This is how we build a community that is future-ready, but more importantly, that is fundamentally human.
