

## **Muis honors the duo that helped rehabilitate radicals, Singapore News & Top Stories**



For more than 20 years, two Muslim religious teachers, Ustaz Mohamad Hasbi Hassan and Ustaz Ali Haji Mohamed, have worked hard to rehabilitate the radicalized singularists.

This includes bombing several embassies and high commissions in 2001 on the plans of the terrorist group Jemaah Islamiah (JI).

Ustaz Ali, 71, and Ustaz Hasbi, 58, worked with the authorities to understand what motivated the JI terrorists and exposed their dissident beliefs. This formed the basis for the Religious Rehabilitation Group (RRG), which established both religious teachers in 2003.

The RRG, which they now lead together, trains religious teachers to advise those who have been influenced or misled by radical teachings. Since its inception, it has conducted more than 1,500 consulting sessions and conducted workshops to combat extremist ideology in schools and mosques. Yesterday, the two men were among the seven people honored by the Islamic Religious Council of Singapore (Muis). They received the Muis50 Distinguished Awards during the annual Muis Awards ceremony.

The Muis50 Distinguished Awards were given in conjunction with the 50th anniversary of the Council and recognize Muslims who have contributed to Muis and the wider community over the past 50 years. 19659007] MUIS AWARD RECIPIENT

In his opening speech, Muis Managing Director Abdul said Razak Maricar: "Looking back on the past 50 years, Muis gives the Muis50 Distinguished Award to seven of these people

Asked how he told Ustaz Ali that he was relieved that Muis recognized the RRG's efforts and underscored the importance of cooperation within the community.

In a press release released yesterday, Muis said the seven winners each received \$ 3,000, but all pledged the money to charity.

The Advisory Board added that these contributions have been merged and increased, donating the amount to five charities for \$ 50,000.

The charities include: Ain Society's Serenity Cancer Center, Casa Raudha Women's Home, Club Heal, Rainbow Center and the Special Needs Association, each receiving \$ 10,000
